

Inspired Writing That Inspires
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The definition of *Inspire*

- to bring about
- to have an animating, enlivening effect
- to influence, move, or guide through divine or supernatural power

The word *inspiration* is found in the New Testament only once, in 2 Timothy 3:16: “All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness.”

The “inspiration” of the human writers didn’t mean that they were human word processors. God employed their human personalities and experiences in the process.

How can our words draw others to God and not us?

1. WHO inspires you?
2. WHAT can you do to be inspired?
3. WHERE are you most inspired?
4. WHEN is your key inspiration time?

When you’re feeling uncreative and blocked, accept it as a time to read and research, and allow the input to stew in the back of your mind until it’s ready to appear.

Inspiration is everywhere. Open your eyes.

To inspire you need to be inspired.

Be inspired by godly influences to produce God-honoring words that inspire.
